Lystek announces new Public Advisory Committee for Southgate residents

Dundalk, Ontario – Lystek International Inc. is pleased to announce the formation of a Public Advisory Committee (PAC) to provide the community of Southgate with an opportunity to stay informed about the proposed Dundalk Organic Waste Recovery Centre. The formation of the Public Advisory Committee is an interim measure that Lystek is initiating on a voluntarily basis as part of its efforts to establish and maintain a high degree of transparency about the Organic Materials Recovery Centre. The 6 to 8 member community group will be provided with regular updates on the project as well as opportunities to make suggestions regarding the development and ongoing operation of the Centre. "The whole idea of this committee is to ensure people have access to all relevant information about the project so that they can stay informed and provide input with respect to potential improvements to our operations," says Mosher.

Lystek is inviting interested Southgate residents to submit their names for consideration for the Public Advisory Committee.

Members of the PAC will convene on a regular basis until final Ministry of Environment (MOE) approvals for the Dundalk Organic Waste Recovery Centre are received. At that time it is anticipated that Lystek will be required by the MOE to create a permanent, Public Liaison Committee (PLC). If so, existing members of the PAC will be considered as candidates for the ongoing PLC.
